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Toolkit and Resources

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What is an LGBTQ+ Friendly Aging Network (FAN)?

The LGBTQ+ Friendly Aging Network (LGBTQ+ FAN) consists of organizations and groups that provide LGBTQ+ welcoming and inclusive aging services. This network can serve as a referral network for older LGBTQ+ people, family caregivers, and professionals seeking LGBTQ+ and HIV+ inclusive services and supports in their communities.

Purpose of an LGBTQ+ FAN

- Connect Aging/Disability Networks at local/state levels interested in supporting LGBTQ+ communities;
- Strengthen engagement with LGBTQ+ communities;
- Address LGBTQ+ Aging concerns including social isolation, family caregiving supports, health/aging disparities, and structural inequalities.



Who can start an LGBTQ+ FAN

Any organization or group of organizations interested in supporting older LGBTQ+ people and their caregivers in accessing services in your community.



Getting Started in Your Community

Organizations, advocates, caregivers, service providers, service users, and more can use this community toolkit to identify organizations and groups that provide LGBTQ+ welcoming and inclusive aging and disability services in their community.



Getting Started in Your Community

Welcoming and inclusive services might look different depending on the type of service offered; however, this toolkit provides resources for how to identify and reach out to organizations and groups that may be beneficial partners in your work to build an LGBTQ+ FAN.

5 Phases for Building LGBTQ+ FAN

- 1. Identifying key partners
- 2. Assessing needs and resources in your community
- Planning develop a road map for creating an LGBTQ+ Agefriendly community network
- 4. Acting put plan into action
- Evaluating what is working, what needs to change how do we keep efforts going



This section is designed to support you in brainstorming the types organizations who would be interested in joining an LGBTQ+ FAN and the benefits of joining.



Criteria to consider for LGBTQ+ FAN Membership

- Organizations, social groups, faith-based communities, and/or businesses committed to LGBTQ+ inclusivity.
- Member organizations have LGBTQ+ and HIV+ nondiscrimination policies for services and employment; and other criteria organizers consider important and reflective of their community.
- Ongoing commitment to best practices and cultural competency education & training.



Membership benefits

- Supports mission-based work of serving ALL members of ones community.
- Networking with LGBTQ+ and HIV+ welcoming organizations, increased visibility, engagements, and collaboration opportunities.
- Connected to resources at the national level as well as <u>SAGECollab</u> partners and LGBTQ+ FANs across the country.



Safety in social environments is key to making an LGBTQ+ Friendly Aging Community. Organizations that promote safety provide services or resources that help individuals feel safe to be their authentic selves; be seen - not having to hide LGBTQ+ identities; be fully included; and have ALL their intersecting identities recognized.

The next few slides provide two Case Scenarios, brainstorming questions and a Community Mapping Framework designed to help you think about the needs of LGBTQ+ older adults and the types of organizations to invite to be a part of the LGBTQ+ FAN.




Case Scenario #1

The family of Kathy, a 67-year-old LGBTQ+ woman, visits your office for a care consultation with concern about Kathy's dementia. Her family indicated that there has been gradual memory decline for the past four years. Now, Kathy quickly forgets conversations, she misplaces items which results in her thinking that other people must have moved or taken the items, she occasionally forgets to go to doctor appointments, & she has gotten lost while driving her car in a familiar location. Kathy's family also reported that her memory for long-term information seems a bit fuzzy. For example, it was stated that she remembers going to church in the past but becomes upset because she no longer attends church. Kathy's partner states that they do not attend church anymore due to discrimination, but she expresses interest in finding new supportive spaces where their LGBTQ+ identities would be respected.

Case Scenario Reflections

- What resources or organizations might you suggest to Kathy's family today?
- What resources or organizations might you suggest anticipating future needs?

Case Scenario #2

An 81-year-old man named Rick was referred for an evaluation. He had previously been diagnosed with Alzheimer's dementia, & he has been living at home with assistance from his partner. He is now unable to learn most any new information & long-term memories are also weak (sometimes forgetting who his partner is). He is sometimes hard to understand due to slurring of words, & he appears to see people who are not in the room.


Rick needs help with bathing, dressing, cutting his own food, & using the toilet. Due to falls, he is usually transported to appointments in a wheelchair. During the conversation, he was unable to state his age, the current month, the current year, or the city where he was located. He was read a list of 3 words but could not remember any of them after just 1 minute. His partner noted that they were struggling to provide care to him, & they asked what resources might be helpful to Rick that will help to address his needs while also respecting his LGBTQ+ identity.



Case Scenario Reflections

- What resources or organizations might you suggest to Rick and his partner?
- What resources or organizations might you suggest anticipating future needs?
- Use the Community Mapping framework on the next slide to identify potential partner organizations to invite to join the LGBTQ+ Fan.





The Community Mapping exercise can be continued on a regular basis as your LGBTQ+ FAN grows and learns more about the needs of older LGBTQ+ people in your community.

Organizations to consider for LGBTQ+ FANs include: Area Agencies on Aging, Alzheimer's Association and Dementia focused organizations, Long-term Care Communities, Home Care Companies, LGBTQ+ organizations, HIV service organizations, LGBTQ+ welcoming Faith-based communities, Elder Care and Estate Attorney's – the list is endless...





Phase 2 - Assessing Needs and Resources



Phase 2 consists of reviewing community needs and resources to help build an LGBTQ+ Friendly Aging/Disability Network (LGBTQ+ FAN).

Phase 2 - Assessing Needs and Resources

Determine Community Readiness

- Key community leaders and organizations including LGBTQ+ older adults and disabled individuals should be involved in determining the community's readiness for building an LGBTQ+ Friendly Aging/Disability Network.
- Caregivers, loved ones, and representatives from the public, private, and nonprofit sectors will also have unique contributions to determining community readiness.
- The team of organizers hoping to build an LGBTQ+ Friendly Aging/Disability Network should also assess what capacity the community will have to evaluate efforts and implement changes as needed.



Phase 2 - Assessing Needs and Resources


- Considerations for long-term network sustainability might include reflecting on effective means of promotion, communication, collaboration, and evaluation.
- Sustainability of the network is key to creating lasting impacts in the community.
- Identifying strengths and gaps in your community's LGBTQ+ inclusivity will involve community feedback as well as tapping into existing surveys, reports, research, or needs assessments.
- Depending on your community, you may want to organize a team to perform a new community needs assessment.

Phase 3 – Planning

The planning phase consists of developing a road map for creating an LGBTQ+ FAN.

Each community's plan for building their network will look unique and be reflective of their community's environment. For example, communities may focus on building an LGBTQ+ FAN Community Resource Guide, host and LGBTQ+ FAN website for information & referrals, or offer support groups to connect LGBTQ+ older adults and their loved ones with needed resources.

Upon review of your community assessment and after determining your community's readiness, setting goals for your LGBTQ+ FAN is key.



Phase 3 – Planning

Outreach to Potential Members

- With goals and engagement criteria in mind, reach out to community organizations and groups who might be interested in joining the LGBTQ+ FAN.
- Invite potential partners to join you for a Zoom or in-person gathering to learn more about the goals and potential for a LGBTQ+ FAN (refer to your Community Map for key partners to contact).
- Assess interest in the initiative. 1:1 conversations might be helpful before inviting potential partners to join a group gathering.
- Connect with a <u>SAGECollab partner</u> or <u>LGBTQ+ Community Center</u> in your area for help with outreach and planning a group gathering to learn more about the LGBTQ+ Friendly Aging/Disability Network.



Phase 3 – Planning

Establishing a Plan

Once you have identified goals and have met with potential partners, consider forming an LGBTQ+ FAN committee with key partners. The committee can begin to establish a plan for what this network will look like in your community. The plan might include:


- establishing membership criteria and development of an LGBTQ+ FAN Membership Charter
- plans for promoting your LGBTQ+ FAN
- ideas for evaluating success of the initiative

Phase 4 – Planning to Action

Phase 4 consists of putting your plan into action to build and promote an LGBTQ+ Friendly Aging/Disability Network (LGBTQ+ FAN). Sharing news of new members and celebrating connections and collaborations in your community are important parts of the network building process.



Phase 4 – Planning to Action

Promotion

- Disseminate information about your LGBTQ+ FAN to inform community members, caregivers, and other organizations of its existence.
- Promotion of the network also encourages other organizations or potential partners to get involved.
- While communities might prioritize a few partners in the beginning of their network building, other organizations might hear about the LGBTQ+ FAN and want to get involved. Establishing a process for new partners to become members will be important.
- Organizations who want to get involved but may not meet membership criteria set by your LGBTQ+ FAN can be connected to trainings such as <u>SAGECare</u>.




Phase 4 – Resources

Reflect on the connections and resources your network organization have in order to help promote the LGBTQ+ Friendly Aging/Disability Network. Consider ways to promote the network using marketing tools and digital/social media.

Phase 5 – Evaluation

Phase 5 consists of reviewing what is working and what needs to be changed in order to sustain an LGBTQ+ FAN.

- A question at the core of Phase 5 is "How do we keep efforts going to support LGBTQ+ older adults in our community?"
- It may be helpful to create an evaluation team, to identify a measurement or assessment tool, and plan for addressing and sharing their findings from the evaluation.



Phase 5 – Evaluation

Measuring common outcomes in your community is essential to evaluating the impact that your LGBTQ+ FAN can have. By collecting evidence on how individuals are using the network for referrals, communities can:

- Use this data to help promote the network
- Motivate other potential partners to become involved
- Serve as a model and inspiration for other communities
- Celebrate success stories
- Adjust when gaps exist
- Communicate what you learn about the needs of LGBTQ+ older adults and disabled individuals



Sample Language for Engagement in a LGBTQ+ Friendly Aging Network (LGBTQ+ FAN)

The following examples are provided for use with outreach to key partners and for developing commitment pledge and/or commitment forms for key partners interested in joining the LGBTQ+ FAN>

General Language for outreach to key partners - "Readiness and Recognition Criteria"

LGBTQ+ Friendly Aging Networks (LGBTQ+ FAN) are organizations and groups equipped to support LGBTQ+ older adults, their care partners, and their loved ones at the local level. As a member of a LGBTQ+ Age Friendly Network, your organization or group commits to the ongoing work of practicing cultural humility and becoming more supportive of LGBTQ+ older adults. Organizations or groups involved in a local LGBTQ+ FAN pledge that their efforts include or strive to include the following factors:

- Inclusion and leadership of LGBTQ+ older adults and their caregivers to shape community support efforts;
- A willingness to collaborate and connect across sectors in order to provide support for LGBTQ+ older adults, their loved ones, and their caregivers;
- Adopting sector-specific LGBTQ+ friendly practices across the organization or group;
- And prioritizing the needs of LGBTQ+ older adults when developing action plans to ensure support for older adults.

The LGBTQ+ Age Friendly Network is an interdisciplinary team of organizations and groups that crosses multiple sectors to provide support for LGBTQ+ older adults at the local level and raises awareness of the specific needs that LGBTQ+ older adults.

"Commitment Pledge" for inclusion on LGBTQ+ FAN to engage potential partners

Our organization or group pledges to take action and commit to supporting LGBTQ+ older adults by creating an inclusive, welcoming and culturally competent and responsive environment, free from discrimination. With this pledge, our organization is committing to practicing cultural humility and taking intentional steps toward adopting policies and practices that foster, cultivate and preserve a culture of diversity, inclusion, fairness and equality for all of our residents and staff, including those who identify as LGBTQ+.

"LGBTQ+ Age-Friendly Network Commitment Form" Language to be signed by key partners joining the LGBTQ+ FAN

We, the undersigned organization, are committed to fostering an inclusive and age-friendly environment that welcomes and supports LGBTQ+ older adults. We recognize the importance of promoting dignity, respect, and equality for all older adults, regardless of their sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression.

As a part of the Age-Friendly Network, we pledge to uphold the following commitments in our efforts to provide comprehensive support to LGBTQ+ older adults:

- 1. **Inclusive Policies and Practices:** We commit to developing and implementing inclusive policies and practices that prioritize the needs and rights of LGBTQ+ older adults. These policies could encompass areas such as employment, service provision, and organizational culture.
- 2. **Training and Education:** We will provide training and education for our staff, volunteers, and stakeholders to increase awareness and sensitivity to LGBTQ+ issues. This training will aim to create a safe and welcoming environment for LGBTQ+ older adults within our organization.

- 7. Collaboration and Partnerships: We will actively seek opportunities to collaborate with other organizations and entities that share our commitment to supporting LGBTQ+ older adults, fostering a strong LGBTQ+ Age-Friendly Network of support and resources.
- 8. Ongoing Evaluation and Improvement: We will continually assess and improve our efforts to support LGBTQ+ older adults. Regular feedback from LGBTQ+ individuals will be integral to this process, and we will adapt and evolve our practices as necessary.



 - Being fully included and ALL intersecting identities recognized




